

Primary and Secondary Care Working Group PSCWG Minutes of the meeting

1. Introduction and welcome (Gottfried Huss)

Alf Nicholson excused for very personal reason. It is the 10th anniversary of foundation of PSGWG

2. Approval of the final agenda

3. News from the EC (Gottfried Huss)

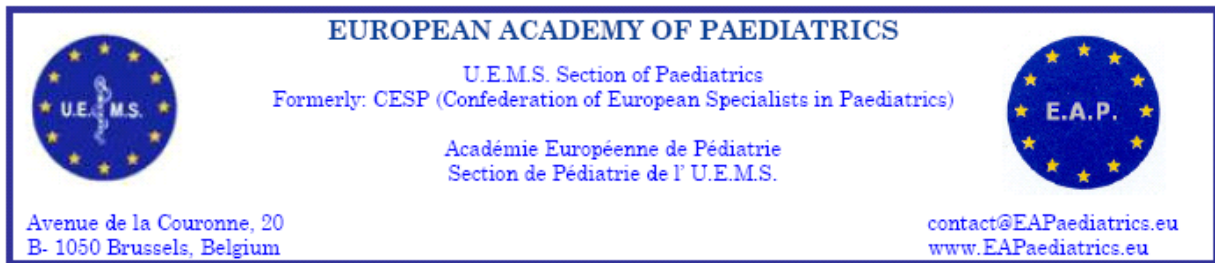
I am very happy of the help brought by Paragon that substituted Kenes in the secretariat. The Website is on-line, you will receive a password in the next days. The SPA – Strategic Pediatric Alliance had a very good meeting on the 10th and it will be reported during GA. One of the messages received is that we have to lobby for our profession and advocate for children and the two are complementary not in contradiction.

4. EAPS congress scientific committee report (Diego Van Esso)

We received more than 2.000 abstract. So we expect 3.000 – 3.500 participant to the congress. Many of you volunteered to review the abstract. Mid June it will be held a meeting in Geneva to allocate the abstract in session. We succeeded to allocate a lot of session on Primary Care. For the first time we will have sessions on Adolescent Health. We have 19 EAP session, some of them EAP/ ECPC combined. A small discussion arose on the methodology of abstract evaluation. Only double randomised trials get a high credit. This controversial methodology will be probably changed for the next edition but it is not possible to change it now. Evaluators are free to apply their own criteria (DvE) Dr. Huss congratulates Dr. Van Esso for the hard work done and the patience expressed in the task. Paediatric Primary care is much more visible in the congress.

5. Report COSI meeting (Gottfried Huss)

See sep protocol from COSI meeting and Presentation on the webpage. The initial quantity of indicators of 1605 could be reduced by the core group to 131. By clustering the existing indicators we could identify missing areas. More delegates approved their participation as godfathers/ experts in the search of the missing indicators.



Terence Stephenson explained the big and costly effort to establish child health indicators in UK and promises to cooperate.

6. Report of Common Trunk meeting

Dr. Biver pointed out that Alf Nicholson put a lot of work in this project and it is easy to criticize. Alf has agreed to take an important job from the government and cannot continue on the project over December, but he wants to continue until December to see the end of this project.

Prof. Tenore pointed out that the work done on GPEG was expected to be done for EAP. The GPEG has the endorsement of the Canadian College of Paediatrician, but incorporates different national system inputs.

Tenore puntualized that the G-PEG format is made miming how we teach at this moment:

Dr. Jaeger – Roman suggested to have taken the G-PEG format, chapters to be reviewed (marked) by a group of us (one every 3 chapters).

The metodolody suggested by Shimon Barak is: Dr. Terence from UK affirmed that it is not possible to go on only working on e-mail. For GPEG we needed to organize a workshop of 3 days for 20 people to get to a productive point. To succeed we need resources focusing on the right things. This brings to a major point of resources. Dr. Huss proposes that the EC and / or the General Assembly has the responsibility to allocate available resources on different project by priorities.

It is proposed to have a 2 weekend workshop for common trunk.

Shimon proposed to add a day to Istanbul stay to start the first one of the 2.

And it is asked to have one of the EC on board because everything that will be decided by the group should by endorsed by EAP.

The coordinator remains Alf until December, the group meeting in Istanbul will decide for the next coordinator.

Decision taken:

1. use the GPEG format
2. The “markers” group will revise it not later than the end of September
3. The will meet in Istanbul to find a consensus with expenses connected to 1 night more.
4. In istanbul the group will decide for the next coordinator substituting Alf Nicholson after december

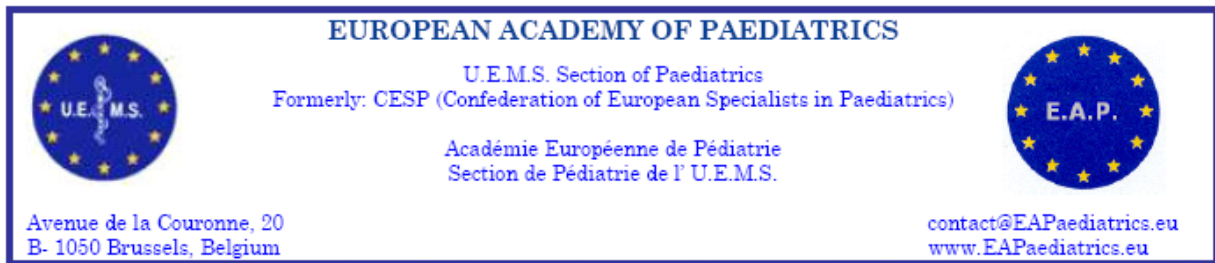

7. News from ECPCP (Eike Jaeger – Roman)

Dr. Jaeger – Roman reported on the European Confederation of Primary Care Paediatricians.

Main goal: advocate for good care at national level. Different organizations joined recently.

Dr. Jaeger – Roman presented the draft speech she is going to have in CIP – Consensus in Paediatric in Moskow next week on behalf of ECPCP on training issues.



Elke slides. Some discussion arouse about the differences and similarities among different nations health system . A long discussion arouse on the different training system and the balance between theoretical and practical training. Another discussion arouse on the training for GPs in Paediatrics that it is compulsory in some countries and not in other. As well in some countries and “hand on” practical training in primary care for paediatrician is not compulsory.

8. Past and future of the Primary Secondary Working Group

I have the feeling that primary care is becoming more and more important and visible. But I have concerns that this group is not completely able to deliver some needed products.

EAP has a lot of tasks but some people who are working and people who not so active. Huss conclusion: Primary & Secondary Care WG and other working groups should cooperate not compete.

9. Call for candidates for next chairs PSCWG



What will be the role of the Head of Primary Paediatrica Care WG? Dr. Van Esso affirms that it is a very important position to give the value to the Primary Care work. Secondary care delegates expresses that they not represented in the WG.

Huss enjoyed beeing the Coordinator of the Group, but he is not able to go on (solo practice) , so he should be substituted at december election. Dr. Barak is willing to present his candidature.

Dr. Wettergren was asked and could consider to be a candidate for Secondary care, also if he could be interesed in promoting the candidature of a nice woman, to move the man – centered EC situation.

10. Any other issue

Gabriela suggest to have EAP presentation in the WONCA congress in June 2013 she is involved it to promote the primary care work and position.
