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Paediatrics in Europe – the EAP concepts

Problems

Primary care:

- No longer any paediatricians in primary care in several European countries
- Increasing competition by GPs all over Europe
- Low income for paediatric services in primary care – time pressure
- No support from politicians and health care administrators for paediatric primary care

Problems

Secondary care:

- No defined minimum standards (staff, budget) for smaller paediatric departments/hospitals
- Scatter of hospitalised paediatric patients across various medical specialities
- Low prestige and standing of paediatricians working in secondary care
- Low income in relation to workload

Problems


Tertiary care:


- Paediatric tertiary care specialities still not recognised in several European countries
- No standardised training and qualification for paediatric tertiary care specialists in those countries
- Self-declared specialist status instead
- Lack of scientifically productive specialised centres in some countries


Problems


Paediatrics as a whole:


- Low prestige and little power in comparison to other medical specialities
- Increasing misunderstandings and distrusts between paediatric generalists and tertiary care specialists
- Lack of a strong and unifying European platform (with sufficient manpower and funds) for all aspects and disciplines in Paediatrics – the "Common Denominator"









Paediatrics in Europe – the EAP concepts

The UEMS-Section of Paediatrics = EAP (formerly CESP)

<u>Assessment of the current situation:</u>

- The EAP/UEMS-SP has developed a wide spectrum of activities, programs, and working groups. This activity spectrum is much wider than the one of any other UEMSsection.
- There is an increasing discrepancy between the size of the section on one side and the dimension and range of activities on the other. A further increase of activity is not possible with the existing structures. Manpower is lacking.



The EAP/UEMS-SP has outgrown its limited manpower capacities!

The need for change

Requirements:


- The EAP/UEMS-SP must substantially increase its manpower capacities.
- The EAP/UEMS-SP must increase its financial resources.
- The EAP/UEMS-SP must further increase its visibility, standing and influence.
- At the same time, the EAP/UEMS-SP must remain the common European platform for all aspects of Paediatrics.
- At the same time, the EAP/UEMS-SP must maintain and further increase its political activity as a section of the UEMS.
- At the same time, the EAP/UEMS-SP must maintain its role in the professional representation of European Paediatrics towards the European Union.


Paediatrics in Europe – the EAP concepts

The need for change

Developments:

- The need for changes discussed 2002 to 2003.
- The concept of an individual-membership European paediatric society discussed 2003 to 2005 (separate society versus change of the EAP/UEMS-SP).
- Strong support for a change of the EAP/UEMS-SP in a meeting with national paediatric societies in Cologne (2005).
- Discussion of various structural options and concepts (2006 to 2007).
- Drafting and discussion of new statutes (2007 to 2008).
- Legal advice on new statutes (2008).
- Approval of new statutes by Belgian Court of Commerce (August 2008).





EAP restructured

Benefits for paediatric tertiary care speciality societies:

- EAP tertiary care group can serve as a platform for meeting other paediatrics tertiary care specialities.
- EAP tertiary care group can serve as a platform for improving the relationship between tertiary and primary, secondary care paediatrics.
- The EAP offers itself as a synchronising body for programs that involve more than one paediatric tertiary care speciality.
- The EAP invites you to contribute to its bi-annual congresses
 → improved visibility in the European paediatric community.
- The EAP invites you to use its journal (ArchDisChild) for position papers, guidelines, consensus statements, etc.

EAP restructured

Benefits for paediatric tertiary care speciality societies (continued):

- EAP offers itself as an interface between paediatric tertiary care speciality societies and UEMS/EU.
- EAP will continue its support for national recognition of all paediatric tertiary care specialities.
- EAP offers itself as a synchronising body for programs that involve paediatric tertiary care speciality societies but extend beyond any single society (training programs, centre visitation and accreditation programs, European examinations, etc.).

EAP restructured

Specific possibilities for the near future:

- Working groups/task forces for specific paediatric tertiary care specialities within the EAP tertiary care group.
- Joint working groups/task forces of several paediatric tertiary care specialities within the EAP tertiary care group.
- Joint memberships paediatric tertiary care speciality society – EAP with clearly visible membership benefits in both formations.
