Paediatricians are asked to help appraising rare disease guidelines according to the AGREE method: Congenital cataract; Cystic fibrosis; Epidermolysis bullosa; Noonan syndrome; Wolfram disease: contact: jenny.harbour@nhs.net

- Pilot Guideline WP 3 "catastrophic antiphospholipid syndrome" This guideline was selected among 44 others as presented (slide 5).

- Coordination and Dissemination: networking and meetings.

During meetings such a paediatric rare disease meeting in Moldavia as the EAPS we address the need of guidelines and e- health. Availability of guidelines in an open resource webbased environment helps less well developed countries.

Proposed is a session/ workshop at meeting in Oslo on the appraisal of rare disease guidelines.

- 4. Report on EU Commission Expert Group on Rare Diseases EAP is represented in the EU expert group.
- EAP has supported the use of ICD, orphacodes, SNOMED and ICF. At the last meeting November 2014 the group adopted 'Recommendation on Ways to Improve Codification for Rare Diseases in Health Systems'.
