

- Monthly online meetings, face-to-face workshop

Uncertainties surveys



- Online survey
- Address wide audience of minor migrants/refugees and their caregivers, as well as health/social workers across Europe
- 1st survey round (May Aug 24): Gather unanswered research uncertainties
- 2nd survey round (Dec 24/Jan 25): Choose and rank most important uncertainties
- Sampling challenges: How to reach migrants who are pushed in most vulnerable positions?

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Addressing Migrant Health Needs by enhancing Pediatric Education



Migrant Health Needs:

- WHO recognizes unique nutritional, psychosocial, cultural, and medical demands for migrants.
- EAP emphasizes pediatricians' role in caring for vulnerable groups, including migrant children.

EAP Curriculum Gap:

Migrant children not currently addressed in EAP Common Trunk Curriculum.

Proposed Initiatives:

- Incorporate Migrant Health in ETR: Integrate migrant health topics into the EAP core curriculum Was suggested 2018/19 by Paul Torpiano YEAP Rep for Migrant Health, well received by EAP
- Current status: proposed structure and wording is already Written and ready to go ©
- Enhance Pediatric Training: Include lectures, assessments, and clinical experiences focusing on migrant health needs.
- Engage Stakeholders: Collaborate with EBP and REACH project

Action plan

- Include Migrant Health into EAP core curriculum
- Advocate for the inclusion of migrant health in pediatric education to address growing demographic trends and unique healthcare needs via REACH network

Planned position papers & recommendations

- Publication introducing the REACH group, the rationale for its foundation and its vision and mission (Veronika Wiemker, Ruud Nijman, Julia Brandenberger)
- Position paper on medical care for migrant children in Europe (Albertine Baauw / Ulrich von Both)
- Comprehensive EU wide recommendation of the top 10 research priorities in pediatric migrant health
